This is a 59-year-old white married woman who was admitted on 7/6/83 and was discharged on 7/29/83.

ADMISSION DIAGNOSIS: Recurrent psychotic depression.

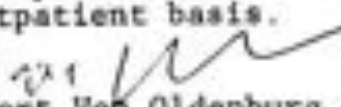
DISCHARGE DIAGNOSIS: Manic-depressive illness; depressed.

The patient has been having cyclic depressions with psychotic reactions. She was admitted by Dr. Hughes for psychotic depression. Dr. Hughes called Dr. Dunn who started shock treatments. After two shock treatments, the patient's family called their family lawyer and served Dr. Hughes and Dr. Dunn with papers that if they continued the shock treatments they would be sued, so Dr. Dunn dropped the case, and they called Dr. Fontana to take over to replace Dr. Hughes who also discontinued the case, and the family called me to look after the patient for her psychotic depression, on 7/16/83. I saw her that day. Even though the patient had come in with a depressed face she was slightly manic. She pretended to know me from before, even though we had never met. I put her on Loxitane 10 mg after breakfast, Loxitane 25 mg HS, on 7/17/83 I put her on Cylert 18.75 mg stat, and as she was obsessed with the fear of going to the state hospital in Concord I tried to reassure her by giving her passes to get out of the hospital. She did enjoy these passes and responded well to them. On 7/19/83, she was transferred officially to my service. On 7/20/83, she was depressed and was put on Vivactil 10 mg after breakfast daily. We discontinued the Loxitane in the morning because she was more appropriate, and we kept sending her home for three-hour passes every day. On 7/22/83, she complained that she was not sleeping well, and I put her on Loxitane 50 mg HS instead of 25, however she still had parkinsonian side effects. I discontinued the Loxitane and put her on Mellaril 50 mg t.i.d. As she was underweight, I requested that she be put on daily weights. I advised her to eat more. On 7/25/83, she complained of constipation and was given some mineral oil with good results. She kept enjoying her visits, but she was afraid that she would never get home permanently. As she was doing well enough she was discharged and will be followed by Dr. Von Oldenburg on an outpatient basis. Chest X-ray was normal. Lumbosacral spine showed transition S1 vertebra and an otherwise normal-appearing spine. CAT scan of the head was normal. EKG was sinus rhythm, 90. Urinalysis was normal. CBC was normal. Chemical screen showed slightly low level of iron and slight anemia. I put her on iron-containing diet, and if necessary I will give her some more iron. Chem-12 revealed slightly high level of sugar on admission. Dexamethasone suppression test was positive. Her sugar test done again on 7/28/83 was 94 which is normal. On discharge, she was given a prescription for Mellaril 50 mg t.i.d. She will be followed by me on an outpatient basis.

This patient was admitted on 07/06/83 with recurrent psychotic depression. The patient has a history of depression. However, today at my visit, I found her more manic, overly friendly, over-talkative. She is delusional, however, confused, inappropriate. She has no insight into her problem and her judgement is inappropriate. She just told me that her husband died yesterday and she has to go and take care of the funeral problems. I wonder that what she says is not true. The patient's manicky behaviour needs immediate attention and care. I would start her on Loxitane 10 mg. stat, 25 mg. h.s. and later I would add Cylert 37.5 mg. a.m. and may go after that into an evaluation for Lithium treatment. The patient will not respond to Lithium instantly, so I will control her behaviour the first week with Loxitane and add Lithium later. I will start her on the treatment immediately and see as we go along. The patient could also be treated with shock treatment. However, I don't do shock treatment and I will treat her with chemotherapy.

MY IMPRESSION: Manic depressive illness. At the present time she is manicky.

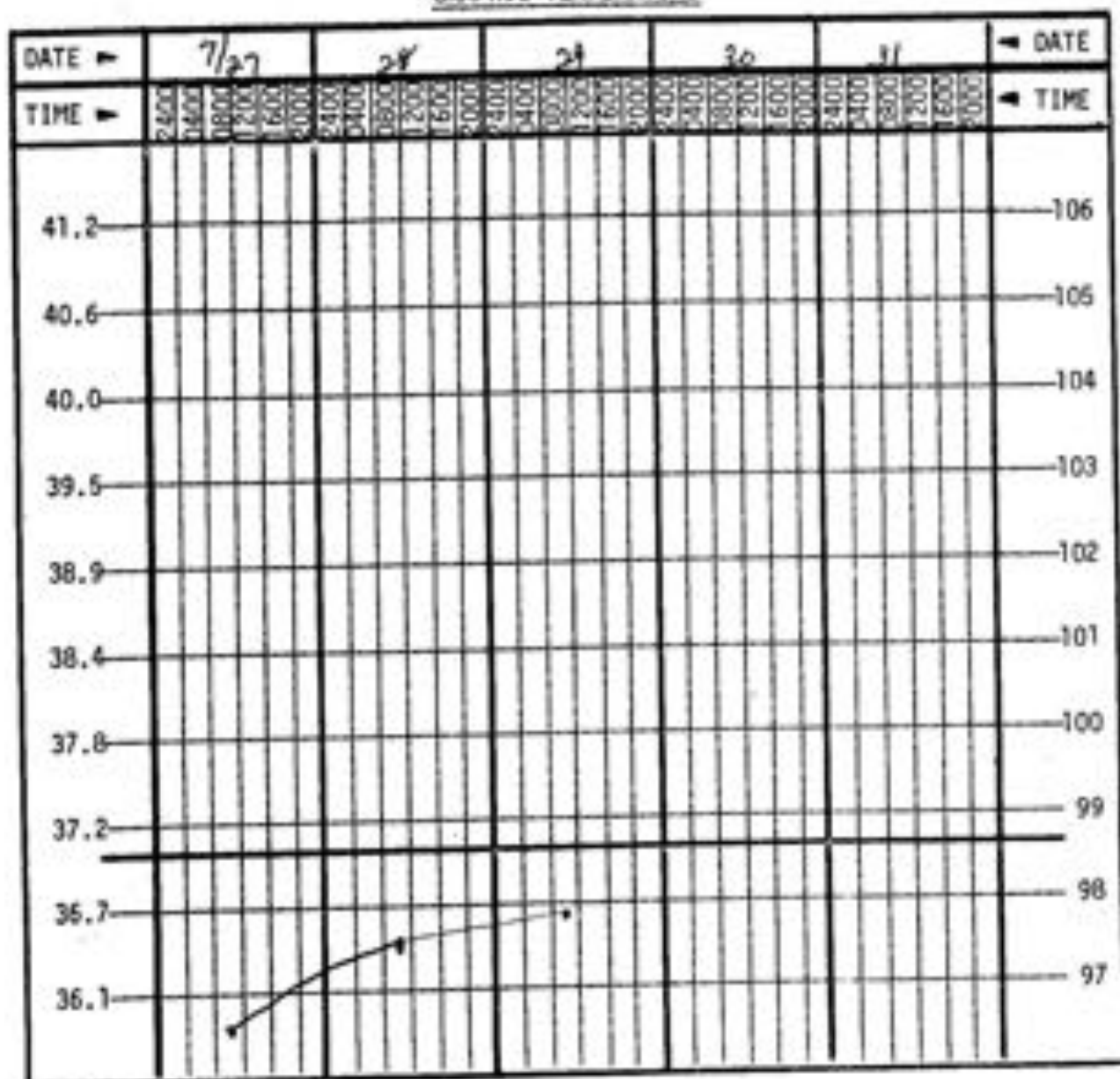
